Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

This Sunday we hear in the Gospel Proclamation the familiar parable of the "talents."

Jesus makes pretty clear that we as baptized Catholics must use all that He has given us to spread His message and help each other to grow in holiness. We are to grow and help the kingdom He began here on earth to grow into the everlasting kingdom of Heaven. We are to be constantly becoming better citizens of that Kingdom, ourselves and recruiting others into the Kingdom.

He also makes the scary and challenging statement that, "For to everyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; but from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. And throw this useless servant into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth."

The last servant did not act out of love and diligence for his master, but rather from self love and laziness. He was only worried about himself not about the Master's project which was going nowhere because he had simply buried his talents and not used them to increase his master's wealth.

God does not want us just to "not do anything wrong," but He wants us to actively "work" at building His Kingdom. He wants us to be out working every day to attract new people to His Church.

The question for us is, what will the master find when He comes back and asks us to make an accounting of what we each did with the talents He gave us during our life here on earth as member of His Church.
