Pastor's Message

Second Sunday of Lent

+2015

Dear Saint John and Epiphany Parishioners,

The Savior, the Lord, the Anointed One, the Messiah. For generations the Jewish people looked forward to the fulfillment of this prophesy. The Prophets had encouraged the people of Israel to base their hope for the future on the coming of the Messiah. They were told to continue in faithfulness to their God because of His plan of salvation for them. How excited they were when this Jesus seemed to "maybe" be this fulfillment.

The Gospel of St. Luke, Chapter 9 begins with the sending out of the disciples with the power and authority to heal and drive out demons. They traveled to the different villages preaching and working miracles. What an amazing high they must have experienced from doing the work of Jesus. Chapter 9, verse 6 says: "...they departed and went through the villages, preaching the gospel and healing everywhere." Then verse 10 recounts the miracle of the five loaves and two fish feeding five thousand men with twelve baskets left over! He is the Messiah! Peter answered Jesus, "The Christ of God."

Then, BANG, the bomb explodes. "The Son of man must suffer. . .be rejected. . . be killed. If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily. . . whoever would save his life will lose it. . . what profit a man if he gains the whole world and loses himself."

How disillusioned and weighed down by sorrow must the disciples have been upon hearing Jesus speak like this. How could a miracle worker be humiliated and killed like this? What is going on? What are we to do, now? Why is He speaking in such negative ways?

Then comes the consolation and glory of the Transfiguration. Our gracious and good God always provides for our need. This glimpse of His Divinity is the gift that will keep them going through the really tough times of persecution and martyrdom.

St. Bede says the Lord allowed Peter, James and John "to enjoy for a very short time the contemplation of the happiness that lasts forever." This is the same consoling Jesus who will also give us throughout our lives the gifts we need to be faithful in any situation. He is always faithful. This is the story of Lent and Easter.




